



## Reading

In whole group reading, students listened to the story, When the Relatives Came, focusing on making connections: text to self, text to text and text to world. They also read and completed activities for a new Scholastic News Magazine, focusing on nonfiction text features.



Students also continued with small groups. Ask your child what they read in their small groups this week.

The Language focus this week was capitalization of the word I, the first word in a sentence and nouns and Proper nouns.

## Math

Students are reviewing how to compare numbers to the hundreds place, learning how to round a number to the nearest 10, using a number line, and reviewing how to find 100, 10 and 1 more than a given number as well as 100, 10 and 1 less than a given number. Students continue to practice fluency in addition and subtraction of numbers up to 20 using Reflex Math. Your child can do this any time at home.



## I(ntervention)-E(nrichment) Time

Twice a week, the second grade will have IE time. During this time, children will either work on skills

that they have not yet mastered or will have an enrichment activity based on the skills they have mastered. Each week the groups will be fluid based on mastery of skills.



## Swimming
